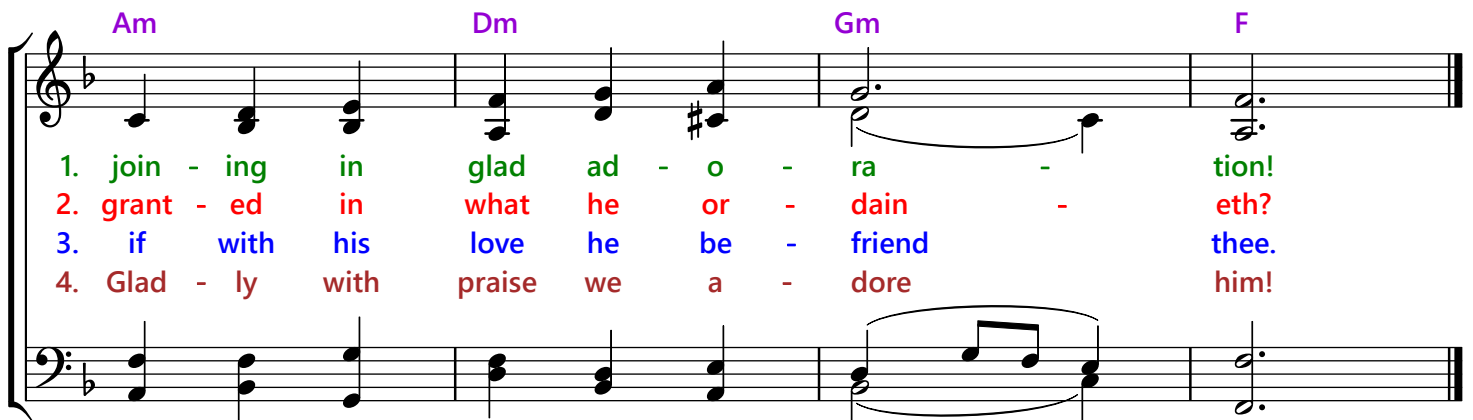
1. Praise to the Lord, the Al-might-y, the King of cre-a-tion!
